

RESOLUTION NO. 993

RESCINDING RESOLUTION NO. 992
REGARDING THE BANKED CAPACITY
OF THE 2019 REAL PROPERTY TAX LEVY
FOR THE CITY OF LYNDEN, WASHINGTON

WHEREAS, the Lynden City Council has properly given notice of the public hearing held November 19, 2018 to consider the City of Lynden Property Tax Levy for the 2019 calendar year, pursuant to RCW 84.55.120; and

WHEREAS, the Council, after hearing, and after duly considering all relevant evidence and testimony presented, determined on November 19th, 2018 that the City of Lynden does not require an increase in property tax levy from the previous year and did so confirm a 0% increase in the 2019 Property Tax Levy with the approval of Resolution No. 992, in addition to the increase resulting from the addition of new construction and improvements to property and any increase in the value of state-assessed property, to discharge the expected expenses and obligations of the City of Lynden.

WHEREAS, under statute RCW 84.55.005(2) (c), the limit factor for a taxing jurisdiction with a population of 10,000 or over is the lesser of 1% or the rate of inflation; and

WHEREAS, RCW 84.55.005(1) defines "inflation" as the percentage change in the implicit price deflator for personal consumption expenditures for the United States as published for the most recent 12 month period by the Bureau of Economic Analysis of the federal Department of Commerce in September of the year before the taxes are payable; and


WHEREAS, "inflation" for September 2018 is 2.169%, meaning the taxes levied in the City of Lynden in 2018 for collection in 2019 by statute are allowed to increase 1% except for the amounts resulting from new construction and improvements to property, and any increase in the value of state assessed utility property; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Lynden City Council given emergent needs of the City is with this resolution rescinding Resolution No. 992, and authorizes a 1% (\$31,520) increase in the regular property tax levy, in addition to the increase resulting from new construction, improvements to property and any increase in the value of state-assessed property and banked capacity; the Council hereby authorizes the levy for the City's use and benefit.
